

As part of their global ministry each February and March money donations are requested to support the 'BLANKET FUND' project. A representative blanket, the kind distributed by the CWS, will be displayed draped over the back pew throughout February and March. Donations can be submitted during the collection and designated BLANKET FUND. The Greatest Love Letter of All Time

Valentine's Day is Mon., February 14. Be thinking now about Valentine greeting cards you can send to those unable to attend worship and are home bound. The first Valentine cards were created and published in 1850. Except for Christmas, more cards are exchanged on Valentine's Day than any other time of year.

A Valentine expresses your love for someone, usually in a few sentimental sentences. The Bible has been described as God's love letter to us. Like a Valentine, verse after verse tells us how much God loves us. "I have loved thee with an everlasting love," He tells us through the pen of the prophet Jeremiah (31:3 KJV). The apostle Paul was persuaded "that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39 KJV). Theologian Karl Barth was once asked, "What is the greatest thought you ever had?" He replied, "Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so." God is love and it is no secret how much He loves you and me. Just open your Bible and read the greatest love letter of all time. Remember your loved ones and sisters and brothers in Christ by sending a Valentine.

Lenten signals




Why should we observe Lent? This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN. We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest self-examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN — to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit. **STOP, LOOK and LISTEN!** These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.

What's in it for me?

Communion takes on new meaning for me when Jesus calls himself the bread of life. The day after feeding the 5,000, Jesus explains, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life" (John 6:54, NIV). Many people stop following him after that, finding the teaching too difficult. Maybe Jesus is challenging people who claim to be his disciples but are in it just for the miracles.

When I hear the Words of Institution, I ask myself if I'm a "What's in it for me?" follower. Do I expect Jesus to merely impress me with answered prayers? Or do I trust him completely and serve him wholeheartedly? Am I like Peter, who, when asked whether I'll leave too, replies, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (v. 68). —Julie Lee
