**MEAT CANNING** - Using Matthew 25:44-45 as a foundation the **Meat Canning** ministry provides hope for thousands of suffering people across the world. For 72 years volunteers from communities and churches all over North America get together annually to 'can' meat. Pork, turkey, chicken and beef is packaged for shipment around the world. Every 'can' of meat is labelled with the words, "In the name of Christ" as a witness. Each year over 30,000 people

volunteer to fill, weigh, wash and label 'cans' for shipment. In a single year's time an average of 450,000 lbs. of chicken, 410,000 lbs. of turkey, 40,000 lbs. of pork and 20,000 lbs. of beef will be shipped and destined for needy families. The **Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM**) interacts with a network of volunteers to repair and/or rebuild damaged homes due to climate destruction, fire or other natural or human caused disasters. A branch of BDM is the Children's Disaster Service (CDS). It's a program serving to care for children directly impacted by disaster. Our financial donations and volunteers have been an immense support to BDM. In 2022 volunteers from Bush Creek travelled to 4 needy disaster sites. Two in North Carolina, two in Kentucky.
