## Ponderings by Pastor Leo



We just celebrated our blessings as a nation with our annual Thanksgiving Holiday. There were parades and football games and many other events as we celebrated our blessings with the harvest season. I celebrated with our farmers that the harvest was in and that it was a good year. Now as we finish one season of physical blessing and well-being, we are looking forward to the season of spiritual blessings.

We are entering the season of Advent. This is a season of preparing for the coming of Jesus into our world.

The word Advent means arrival or coming and in our Christian calendar it refers to several things. It refers first to the coming of Jesus to be born and to live among us. Secondly, it refers to the advent of Jesus into the hearts of all who will receive him. Thirdly, it refers to his Second Coming at the close of history.

Jesus came to restore us to a personal relationship with God our Father and to free us from the many burdens of the Law and of traditions and expectations placed upon us. God's chosen people saw Him as distant and unapproachable. Jesus came to show us that He loves us so much that our God invites us to approach Him and that He wants to be part of our lives. Jesus brought us into peace with God the Father.

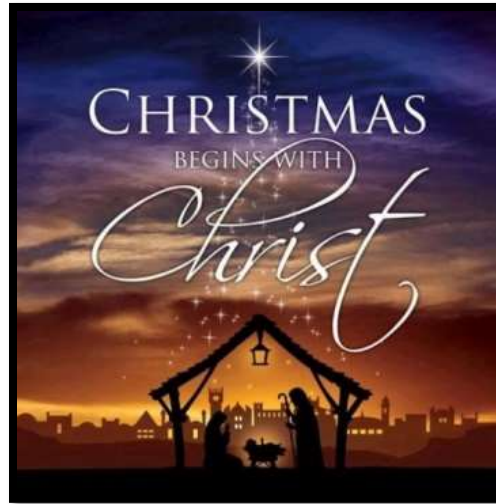
In John 14:27 Jesus says "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." The Hebrew word for peace is Shalom. However, "peace" is only one small part of the meaning. Shalom is used to both greet people and to bid them farewell, and it means much more than "peace, hello or goodbye". Hebrew words go beyond their spoken pronunciation. Each Hebrew word conveys feeling, intent and emotion. It is a wonderful word that means so much more than just peace. It is not just an absence from war or turmoil, it is a complete peace. It is a feeling of contentment, completeness, wholeness and well-being. This is the peace Jesus wants us to enjoy this Advent Season. **Shalom.**

A 430,000-square-foot **Museum of the Bible** has been under construction in Washington, D.C. (two blocks from the National Mall and three blocks south of the Capitol). The new museum opened recently. The museum will use cutting-edge technology to bring the Bible to life. Examples of exhibits include:

- Narratives of the Bible & Nazareth Village: walking through the narratives of the Hebrew text from Genesis to Chronicles and then through first-century Nazareth, ending **with the story of the New Testament.**

- The History of the Bible: following the Bible from its origins as a series of writings accessible to only a small group of people, through many changes in form and adoption by multiple faith traditions, to the most widely read text in history.

- The Impact of the Bible; exploring the Bible's impact over time on cultures, civilizations, and daily life, including its profound influence on fine arts, science, government, music, film and more.

## Baby Shower for Jesus ...

In the Christian Year, Epiphany begins on January 6. Epiphany means “manifestation” or “appearance” and refers to three manifestations of Christ’s lordship, the most familiar being the recognition of Jesus by the wise men (the epiphany to the Gentiles). The Gospel of Matthew records the wise men (or Magi) coming to Herod, asking “Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.” Upon finding Jesus, they offered gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

You may have come across the tongue in cheek version of how things might have been different, had the Magi been women -- they would have asked for directions; they would have arrived on time; they would have helped deliver the baby; they would have cleaned the stable; they would have made a casserole; and they would have brought practical gifts. That’s all well and good, but it is only in jest. We know there was huge significance to the gifts the Magi did bring, and that they traveled at great cost and sacrifice to seek out the King, arriving in God’s-ordained time.

However, as we approach Epiphany this year and we recall the gifts the Magi brought to the young Jesus, let’s consider ... what might we do to remember their gifts, and more importantly, to honor Jesus, who came to us as a baby? The Missions & Service Commission is sponsoring a **Baby Shower for Jesus** – an opportunity to offer some “practical gifts.” Everyone is invited to bring typical baby shower gifts – diapers (especially the larger sizes), baby wipes, wash cloths, baby clothes, blankets, bottles, etc. – to the worship service **January 7** and to place them beneath the Christmas tree at the front. **Please do not wrap your gifts.** If you have difficulty with the steps, surely someone will assist you with your gifts.

Gifts will continue to be collected during the month of January, and can be placed in the coat room. At the end of the month, our baby shower gifts for Jesus will be donated to Care Net Pregnancy Center of Frederick – an opportunity to assist mothers who have chosen life for their unborn babies, and a tangible remembrance of the One who came as an infant, to bring us all eternal life.
